HISTORY

The Society was formed in 1968 when a group of social workers who had completed psychoanalytic training experienced the need for professional support. The Society has assisted in the development of a code of ethics, defeated a move to have clinical social workers supervised by psychologists, fought for the ability to obtain insurance reimbursement, and, after twenty years, the State of New York enacted a license procedure for clinical social workers. That law became effective in September, 2004.
