Title: Bargaining with God and Man: A Mediator's Approach

Description: From before the time of the Bible to the present day, conflict has always been with us. Come out and discuss with us an exchange between God and Abraham, the Camp David Accords that led to the peace treaty between Egypt and Israel, disputes between parents and teachers in the area of special education, and more. What is mediation? How does mediation work, and what are its limitations?
