The concepts of “traumatizing narcissist” and the “traumatizing narcissist’s relational system” and how they relate to couples therapy will be explained. The traumatizing narcissist seeks to invalidate and suppress the subjectivity of the other, while instilling fear and diminishing the other’s self-esteem. The other experiences intense dependency and intense fear of loss, which leads to self-subjugation. Numerous clinical examples of this pattern will be provided, along with clinical implications and audience participation.

Daniel Shaw, LCSW is a clinical supervisor and faculty member at The National Institute for the Psychotherapies in Manhattan. He has been the past Co-Chair of the Continuing Education Committee for the International Association for Relational Psychoanalysis and Psychotherapy. He is the author of numerous published papers, and he is preparing a forthcoming book for the Relational Psychoanalysis Series, Routledge Press, on the theme of traumatizing narcissism. He is in private practice in Nyack, NY and in Manhattan.
